Suggested activities

Here are a few ideas to celebrate the Bicentenary of Catholic education in Australia or come up with your own events and activities

- 200 years National Launch celebrate the official launch of 200 years celebrations (week commencing 22 February 2021 - check your diocese, state or territory for details)
- National Mass in each Diocese on the Feast Day of Our Lady Help of Christians on 24 May 2021
- Distribute and pray the 200 Years of Catholic education national prayer at all school assemblies, diocesan and events (check your diocese, state or territory for details)
- Sing the 200 years of Catholic education national song, 'Faith in the Future' by Fr Rob Galea at school assemblies, diocesan and events
- Contribute a testimonial/video to the Your Stories page on the <u>200 years website</u>
- Contribute an historical photo and caption to the Gallery or Timeline page the <u>200 years website</u>
- Take an aerial photo of your whole school in the shape of 200 and email to the 200 years website
- Pre order commemorative pins for your school students and staff from the <u>200 years website</u>
- Display your 200 years fence banner and posters
- Include 200 years general information in school newsletters and social media to reach parents and carers and the wider community
- Organise a whole school/class Masses/Assemblies/ Liturgies and invite prominent alumni, past staff and families, and local members of parliament
- Get students to make Bicentennial Anniversary thank you cards to send to religious orders, clergy, staff and alumni who played a role in your school's history
- Create a time capsule with contributions from current students, staff and families, alumni, and former staff and families

- 200 years historical dress up day
- Learn about the early days of Catholic education in Australia via the timeline on the <u>200 years website</u> or do your own research as part of a learning activity
- Research and play school yard games from yesteryear
- Play the Bicentennial Games Quiz from the 200 years website or create your own school history quiz
- Compile your school history/timeline launch on your schools' feast day
- Interview alumni from your school about their favourite memories of Catholic education
- **Fundraise** for a specific education project that will assist disadvantaged children to receive an education or other important cause
- Perform Acts of Kindness in your local community
 (ie. early years could draw pictures/write stories
 about their favourite things at school to send to aged
 care residents; older years could build and donate
 care packs to local disadvantaged groups)
- Interview teachers about how long they have been teaching and how they have seen classrooms and schools evolve (ie. technologically, campus growth, uniform differences etc.)
- Find out how many staff and students were at your school when it opened and how many are there today and create visual representations of this to be displayed somewhere in the classroom/school
