

Live4Life launches in Ballarat

Diocese of Ballarat Catholic Education Ballarat is proudly partnering with the City of Ballarat, Ballarat and District Suicide Awareness Network, Ballarat Community Health, Department of Education, Wellways, CAFS, Headspace, Victoria Police and The Y Ballarat to deliver Live4Life in Ballarat.

The award-winning **Live4Life program** will roll out in eight secondary schools across the City of Ballarat in the coming months, focusing on increasing mental health knowledge amongst students, parents, teachers and other community members to reduce barriers for young people seeking help.

Live4Life, a not-for-profit health promotion charity, is the only mental health education and youth suicide prevention model designed specifically for rural and regional communities.

The program has four key components of delivery:

Evidence-based mental health education in schools Partnership of schools and community organisations Mentoring support from Youth Live4Life Youth participation and leadership via 'Youth Crew'

Year eight students at Damascus College, Ballarat & Clarendon College, Ballarat High School, Phoenix Community College, Mt Clear College, Mt Rowan Secondary College, Ballarat Christian College and Woodmans Hill Secondary College will be involved in the 2023 implementation of Ballarat Live4Life. In 2024, Ballarat Live4Life program will be delivered to Year 8 and 10 students, with the potential to be expanded into more local schools.

City of Ballarat Mayor, Cr Des Hudson said the Live4Life initiative was more than just a response to youth mental health within the school environment, it is a whole community approach.

"We want to ensure that young people, teachers, parents and the wider community are better informed about mental health and are proactive in identifying the signs and symptoms of an emerging health issue before a crisis occurs," he said.

"This course, delivered by locally based trained instructors, is designed to improve the mental health knowledge, skills and attitudes of our community.

"It is about the entire Ballarat community working together to save lives."

The major sponsors of the activation stage of the Live4Life model are Western Victoria Primary Health Network, the Ballarat and District Suicide Awareness Network and the Ballarat Friends of India. "With 110 adults in the community having already undertaken training in Youth Mental First Aid and 20 community members putting their hands up to be Teen Mental Health First Aid Instructors in the local community, Live4Life in Ballarat is off to a great start.

CHAPLAINCY...

National Student Wellbeing Program - (Formerly National School Chaplaincy Program).

Funding round 2024 - 2027

What is currently known as the National School Chaplaincy Program will enter a new funding round in 2024. The program will be renamed the National Student Wellbeing Program which recognises the roles of both chaplains and student wellbeing officers.

Advice provided to CECV suggests that the Department of Education will provide application details to schools at the commencement of Term 2 and schools will have 4 weeks to complete an application. We are providing this information today as a forewarning in the hope that time to complete the required application is factored into your planning for the first 4 weeks of Term 2.

We will forward application details to schools as soon as they are made available. We have been advised that the application process will be quite similar to that which took place in 2020. In preparation, Schools that did apply in 2020 are advised to locate your previous application to familiarise yourself with the detail that will be required. While the pool of Commonwealth funds will provide funding to a small percentage of schools within the Diocese of Ballarat it is advantageous to us a Diocesan Education Community to ensure we receive the maximum funding possible from this source.



REQUIREMENTS FOR ALLIED HEALTH ASSESSMENT, THERAPY AND FEEDBACK

Standardised assessments such as the WISC-V, WIAT-III, CELF-5, and other assessments require particular set-ups to be completed with fidelity.

Although CEB Psychologists and Speech Pathologists will always be as accommodating as possible, it is good for school staff to be aware of the recommended room requirements.

What kind of room should be provided?

A quiet room free of distractions and a comfortable temperature.

A **standard rectangular or square table** is ideal for assessment and therapy. Most assessments completed by a psychologist require the examinee (student) to be **directly opposite** the examiner (psychologist).

Many tasks on the psychological tests can be invalidated if the student is distracted during assessment (e.g. working memory tasks)

However, many Speech Pathologists prefer to be at a right angle to the student.

The room should therefore be in a quiet area of the school, and nobody should enter for the duration of the session (e.g., to collect photocopying or find a book)



How long will it take?

Psychologists usually block out between 90 and 120 minutes (2 hours) to complete an assessment.

Speech Pathologists generally allow 60 to 90 minutes to complete an assessment.

Speech review sessions can take up to 20 minutes

Feedback sessions with staff and parents usually take between 30 and 60 minutes.

• Has the classroom teacher been informed?

- Is the student being taken out of their **favourite activity** to complete the assessment? We find students are happier if they aren't missing out on a preferred activities.
- If the **student is absent** on the day of testing, or if it's not the best day for testing, please contact us as soon as possible to advise us and reschedule the appointment.
- Please ensure that the student is wearing their sensory aids if applicable (i.e., glasses, hearing aids, etc.)
- Has the student had their prescribed medication (e.g., ADHD medication, diabetes medication).
- At times students may be able to take breaks Let us know of any breaks the student would normally take (e.g., fruit break) so we can accommodate these.

WON'T vs. CAN'T Keep this in mind as you work with students who have executive function difficulties!	
What looks like "won't"	May actually be "can't"
Opposition, stubbornness	Cognitive inflexibility, effort to avoid being overwhelmed
Rudeness	Difficulty controlling impulses
Lack of effort	Poor initiation; impaired planning, or attention
Refusal to put good ideas on paper	Poor fine motor skills, disorganization
Self-centeredness	Impaired ability to take another's perspective
Sloppy, erratic work	Poor impulse control and self-monitoring; overload
Disinterest in school	Impaired attention and working memory
