## Gemma Sisia

St Jude's was built on Gemma's belief that everyone has the right to an education. Since 2002, Gemma has seen the school grow to offer free, quality education to 1,800 students across three campuses.

Gemma has travelled the world spreading the word about The School of St Jude; from the International Rotary Convention to the TEDx stage, she has inspired people of all ages and from all walks of life with her story. Gemma's achievements have seen her honoured as a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) and awarded a Sapphire Paul Harris Fellow by Rotary International.

## Maddie Kelly

Maddie first heard about The School of St Jude whilst she was attending St Aloysius College, SA, and knew the school would be a big part of her life. After an initial two-year contract with St Jude's, she helped launch the school's Alumni Association and support alumni like Enock. As author of the newly published book, *The School that Hope Built*, Maddie spent hours interviewing staff, students, alumni, parents and supporters to capture their unique voices on the page.

## Enock Ephrahim

Enock spent 12 years of his academic life at The School of St Jude. After graduating in 2015, he joined the Beyond St Jude's Scholarship Program. Enock spent the following year volunteering at the school before winning a scholarship to study Business, Finance and Statistics at the University of Rochester in New York, USA; before going on to secure internships with international companies in Tanzania and Ghana.

Enock co-founded the Alumni Diaspora, an initiative that brings together St Jude's alumni from all over the world to share opportunities and support the school. Enock is now back at St Jude's where he works with the Alumni team, helping hundreds of alumni reach their potential beyond the school gates.
