Recontextualisation is described within the Enhancing Catholic School Identity Project (ECSI) as an approach to teaching and learning that “seeks to invite culture and Christianity into the dialogical process of (re)interpreting Christian faith for a contemporary context while preserving its recognizable, credible and meaningful expressions as found in Catholic tradition” (Pollefeyt and Richards, 2020). The process for recontextualisation is not one which follows a blueprint. So much depends on the passion and skill of leaders, teachers and students to engage in the dynamic process that draws upon and at the same time builds and renews the faith tradition in dialogue with the context.

Presented in association with Australian ECSI Professional Learning Consortium, this conference offers an opportunity to showcase new learning and ongoing research into recontextualising pedagogies exploring 4 areas: Leadership; Student agency; Teacher professional learning; Teacher practice.
