

## Tailored immersion opportunity inspired by Saint Mary of the Cross Mackillop and her mentor Father Julian Tenison Woods.

This pilgrimage begins at Naranga, Port MacDonnell in South Australia, where Mary boarded a boat in 1867 to continue on her journey to sainthood. Over four days you will walk together across the Limestone Coast landscape to Pinechunga, Penola. The birthplace of the Josephites and where Mary discovered her love of teaching.



**Available for staff and senior school students**, four days of walking, carry day pack only. Each member of the group will receive their Camino passport and shell. Travellers passport shall be stamped at each stop on the pilgrimage, a great memento to take home.

Min of 6, Max of 10 participants (larger groups can be accommodated however accommodation options need to be reviewed.)



**Your group will enjoy a pleasant walking pace** as we traverse the landscape offering time to reflect, and connect with nature. The beauty of the natural environment and small challenges contribute to the experience as does the comradeship of fellow travellers.



On the final day you will gain a deeper understanding of Mary's pathway to sainthood with a visit to the Mary MacKillop Interpretative Centre in Penola, where you will receive your final stamp in your traveller's passport and Compostela.
