COMS NCCD QA & RESOURCES

1. NCCD Submission for Schools Tutorial presentation and pre-recorded webinar

- This updated presentation and webinar provide step-by-step instructions for school principals and staff to enter and submit data. Please note only your school principal can submit your school's data.
- Schools can start entering NCCD data now via CEVN.
- We recommend that your school admin officer / registrar uploads a "current student details file" now to ensure that your enrolment data is reflected accurately in the CEVN system. Refer to the tutorial for instructions.



2. Moderation and Quality Assurance

- Brief pre-recorded webinar
- Extended (new LDL) pre-recorded webinar, presentation and case studies discussed.
- Link to all related Moderation resources.

Please ensure that you coordinate a time for a Quality Assurance Consultation with your NCCD Key Contact. As stated in the COMS (and further outlined in the webinars), it is preferable that you conduct moderation prior to the consultation.

All QA consultations must occur prior to NCCD submission (6 August 2021)

3. Other resources

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4. NCCD Information Sheet for parents

Reminder to ensure that you include the NCCD Information Sheet for parents in your newsletter for **at least 3 cycles**

5. Census 2021 - Special Circumstances Applications

As noted in the NCCD Submission Process for Schools Tutorial presentation and pre-recorded webinar (please refer email sent 03/05/2021 and COMS), students have to attend the school during the Census Reference Period (this period is the 20 days leading up to and including census day) in order to be included in August census. Where students do not attend during the Reference Period but otherwise meet Census eligibility criteria, schools can submit a separate Special Circumstances Application.

How schools submit Special Circumstances Applications to the Australian Government Department of Education, Skills and Employment (the department) is currently being reviewed by the department. Regardless of the outcome of this review, the eligibility rules and required information will not change. To best prepare your application, please ensure you have the following supporting documents:

- Evidence of the student's intent and the date they are returning to school.
- For long periods of absence, evidence the school has engaged the student in education.
- If attending another school while absent, evidence of how the "away" school has reported (or not reported) the student in their Census.

All applications and supporting documents for **Special Circumstances Applications must be submitted by Friday, 20 August 2021**. More information about the Special Circumstances Application will be available by email and news updates on SchoolsHUB or contact Susan Rampling or your NCCD Learning Diversity Education Officer if you have any further questions.

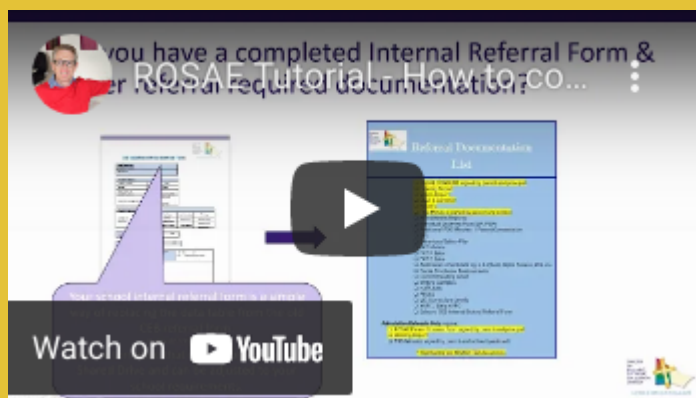

ABC Vision Concern Checklist

On identification of a student requiring interventions or specialised supports, **best practice is a vision examination by an optometrist.**

Failing this, the checklist below is to be completed by the classroom teacher (Primary) or nominated teacher (Secondary) in consultation with student and their parent(s)/ guardian(s).

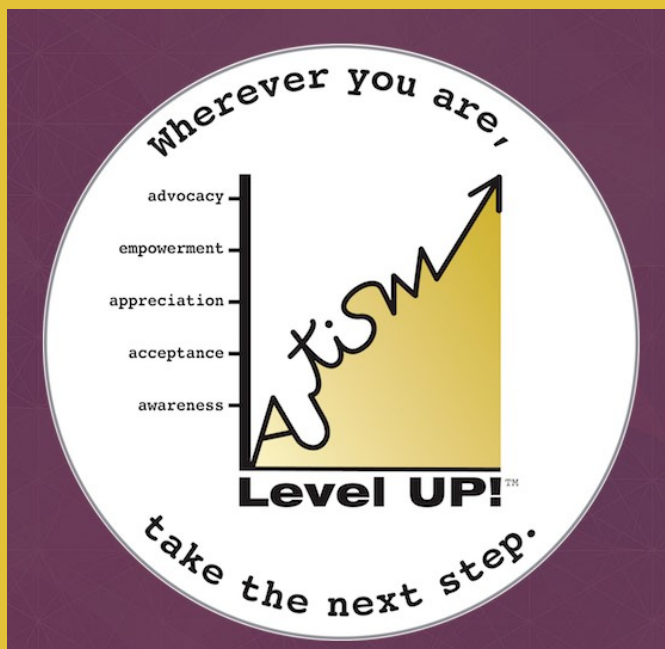

Use your school's VRQA number FOR BOTH SCHOOL NUMBER AND PASSWORD

The login form includes the logos for the Victorian Government, Education and Training, ABLES, and The University of Melbourne. It contains two input fields: 'Enter your school number' and 'Enter your password (School number as default)'. Below these fields is a 'LOGIN' button.

Abilities Based Learning and Education Support (ABLES) is a curriculum assessment and reporting suite that:

- allows teachers to assess the learning readiness of students with disabilities and additional needs
- generates reports for individualised learning planning
- provides guidance and strategies to help teach students based on their individual learning needs, linked to the Victorian curriculum and resources
- tracks student progress and achievements over time.

There are five modules, each focusing on a specific element of the ABLES suite of resources and each requiring approximately one hour of online participation per module.

The professional learning modules provide information on how to:

- complete ABLES assessments
- interpret and use the reports which the assessments generate
- link reports to curriculum planning, teaching and learning strategies.
