Greetings to all

I was intending to send this out today. With the lockdown now announced I have made a few changes so as not to confuse people too much. The Diocese will send out further information today.

Last week's principals and priests forum held in Ballarat dealt with some interesting changes regarding Catholicism today:

- We were reminded of the inclusiveness nature associated with new emphasis on the *People of God* coming out of the Second Vatican Council;
- New associations of Public Juridic Persons and new ecclesial ministries are now assuming responsibilities for work previously done by others;
- With new entities for governance of Catholic Education, there is an associated transfer of responsibility for charism and mission;
- The need to nurture the parish/school relationship as we come to terms with changing governance structures in the Australian Church's historical partnership between parish and school;
- As more Catholics see their association with the Church expressed within the school context, there will be changing expectations for those charged with care of the charisms and mission of these new entities.

The first of the Council of Priests meetings for this year will be on Tuesday, June 22, 2021. Following the meeting will be a dinner to celebrate those having significant ordination anniversaries this year: John Keane, John Monaghan, Michael McKinnon (40 years), Michael Linehan, Peter Hudson (50 years), Peter Connors (60 years), Dan Arundell and Damian Heath (65 years). Because of lockdown, and our inability to celebrate last year, this year's candidates have welcomed last year's candidates, George Kuruvila (25 years) and Patrick Flanagan (60 years), to join the celebrations.

Next Tuesday there was to be a gathering of overseas born clergy in ministry in the diocese. At the retreat earlier in the year, the overseas born clergy met with the Vicar General and Michael McKinnon regarding working in the Australian context. At this meeting it was decided to have a number of gatherings during the year and focus on the following:

- Australian Church History;
- History of the Ballarat Diocese and pertinent issues that have shaped our local Church;
- Diocesan pastoral vision within an Australian cultural context and the empowerment of the People of God;

- Catholic Education, DOBCEL and related issues;
- Parish finance, child safety and other issues related to compliance;
- Australian political structures and policies;
- Indigenous culture and issues related to European settlement.

This meeting will now be rescheduled.

I wish you all the best with your endeavours and pray that further developments do not impede our attempts at love of God and neighbour.

Ballarat Diocesan College of Consultors Executive Summary

Meeting held Tuesday, April 20, 2021 via Zoom

Plenary Council Prayer: Led by Bishop Paul Bird.

In attendance: Bishop Paul Bird, Frs John Monaghan, Marcello Colasante, John Fitzgerald, Andrew Hayes and Ed Moloney.

Apologies: Frs Kevin Maloney and Kevin Lenehan.

Minutes of previous meeting: The minutes of the meeting held February 16, 2021 were accepted.

Plenary Council Session 2021: At the February meeting, the Consultors noted the planning for the session of the Plenary Council to be held from October 3–10, 2021. There was a question of whether COVID restrictions might require the Plenary Council members from Victoria to meet in two venues. The Consultors agreed that Ballarat could provide one of those venues. However, further discussion at the state level has come to the view that all the Victorian members will be able to be accommodated at one venue, namely, the Catholic Leadership Centre in Melbourne.

Sacristy Register Books: Priests visiting our diocese for ministry are required to obtain permission through the Ballarat Diocesan Office. This involves providing their Australian Catholic Ministry Register (ACMR) number or equivalent documentation. In addition, such visits need to be recorded in the parishes in which they minister. To help facilitate this process, Bishop Paul has sent a copy of a "Sacristy Register" book to each parish. If a parish considers it appropriate to have additional copies of the Sacristy Register book, they can obtain further copies through the Bishop's Office.

Funding of Professional Standards Claims: Bishop Paul provided a summary of the payments made since 1995 in response to claims against the diocese for clerical abuse. He also provided an estimate of future payments. The discussion highlighted the need for careful stewardship of resources so that the diocese can continue to respond to such claims, while also continuing to fund the various services provided by the diocese.

Meeting held Tuesday, April 20, 2021 via Zoom

Prayer to St Joseph (in the Year of St Joseph): Led by Bishop Paul Bird.

Minutes of previous meeting: The minutes of the meeting held February 16, 2021 were accepted.

Update on items from previous meeting:

- Parishes of Mortlake and Terang: Fr Michael McKinnon's appointment as Administrator of these parishes has been extended until June 30, 2021, as his travel to Peru is still delayed due to COVID-19 restrictions. This arrangement will continue until this travel is permitted.
- **Fr Eladio Lizada OSJ:** Fr Eladio is living at Ballarat East and providing ministry as Assistant Priest in the Cathedral Parish on weekdays and in Redan/Sebastopol/Linton parishes on weekends.
- **Enhancing Catholic School Identity (ECSI):** Priests of the diocese have been invited to enrol in a twelve-week ECSI on-line training course offered by Australian Catholic University.
- Pastoral Placement of Seminarian: From mid-2021 until mid-2022, Cay Xuan Trinh will join the team in the Western Border Parish.

General Business:


- The Board noted that Fr Ed Moloney will complete his appointment at the seminary at the end of 2021 and will then return to ministry in the diocese.
- The Board noted several changes anticipated to occur from 2021–2023 that will affect the following parishes:
 - Mortlake and Terang: After Fr Michael McKinnon leaves for Peru;
 - Warrnambool East: Fr Lawrence O'Toole will be 75 in May 2022;
 - Apollo Bay: Fr Wally Tudor will be 75 in June 2023.

Continuing Formation for Priests: The Board highlighted the importance of continuing formation for priests to enable them to develop their ministry gifts to the full.

Reduction in priest numbers and declining Mass attendances: The Board noted that a reduction in priest numbers is occurring at the same time as a general decline in numbers of parishioners attending Mass. In reflecting on priests' appointments, the Personnel Board will need to consider questions of overall pastoral planning as well as questions of the particular gifts of individual priests and their suitability for particular ministries.

Director of Clergy Life and Ministry: After serving in this role for ten years, Fr John Monaghan has proposed that the role be entrusted to someone else. Bishop Paul thanked Fr John for his dedicated service to the priests of the diocese in organising retreats and seminars, as well as his support for Mrs Sonia Walker in her role as Clergy Health and Wellbeing Coordinator. The Board made several suggestions for Bishop Paul to consider for appointment to succeed Fr John Monaghan as Director of Clergy Life and Ministry.

Dates for meetings of Personnel Board in 2021: These meetings will follow the meetings of the College of Consultors on Tuesdays, June 22, August 3, September 28 and November 23 in the Diocesan Offices Board Room.



National Mass to celebrate 200 years of Catholic Education in Australia

A National Mass was celebrated across all states, territories and dioceses on Monday, May 24, 2021 (the Solemnity of Our Lady Help of Christians - Patron Saint of Australia), to commemorate 200 years of Catholic education in Australia.

Mass was celebrated at St Patrick's Cathedral Ballarat by Fr Kevin Maloney VG and Monsignor Glynn Murphy at 10.00am. Representatives from 30 school communities across the diocese were in attendance. Bishop Paul was an apology for this Mass due to illness.

All Saints Parish School in Portland was the first Catholic school to open in the Ballarat Diocese 172 years ago in May 1849, making it the second Catholic school to open in the Colony of Victoria (District of Port Philip). St Patrick's Parish Primary School opened in Port Fairy a short time later in July 1849.

Prime Minister, Mr Scott Morrison, recorded a congratulatory message to the Catholic education community for the occasion. More information and photos from the Mass is available here.

We Remember



Sr Monica Butler rsm

Mary Cecilia Butler was born in Birchip in 1927. She had two brothers, John and Leo (both deceased). Monica attended primary school at St Mary's Birchip, completed her secondary education at St Mary's College Bendigo and trained as a teacher at the former Sacred Heart Teachers' College in Ballarat East. She was professed as a Sister of Mercy in 1948 and took the name of Mary Monica.

Thus began a long life of service in education for over 50 years in the Ballarat diocese, where she taught at Birchip, Ballarat East, Edenhope, Mortlake, Penshurst, Wycheproof, Timboon and Sebastopol and was Principal at Dunnstown, Ballarat East, Donald, Manangatang and Mortlake.

But Monica was not just a teacher. She was also involved in parish ministry wherever she lived and for a time lived at Timboon and worked in the motor mission, giving religious instruction to isolated children.



Monica was a great devotee of Dr Mary Glowrey, collecting information about her life while her cause for canonisation was in progress. Monica was also involved in the Catholic Women's League, being Ballarat Diocesan Secretary of CWL for some time.

We give thanks for Monica's long life of service to God's people and of companionship with us over many years.




Vinnies launches 2021 Winter Appeal to support homelessness
