Education

- early childhood teachers

- roles within DE regional services and programs, such as Student Support Services and school nurses

Maternal and Child Health

- roles within Maternal and Child Health services in councils
- roles within Aboriginal
 Maternal and Child Health
 services and Aboriginal-led
 Maternal and Child Health

- roles within the Maternal Child Health Line
- roles within community health organisations

Child Protection Services

- roles within Department of Families, Fairness and Housing (DFFH)

Commission for Children and Young People (CCYP)

What information is <u>not</u> on Child Link?


The information displayed on Child Link is limited to data sourced from Victorian Government information systems.

Child Link will not include:

- Family violence intervention orders
- Commonwealth information, such as Medicare or the Australian Immunisation Register information.
- Case management records such as case notes, professional opinions or health records
- Criminal record information



Where Child Link information comes from – source systems



Child Link: security and privacy



Child Link has been designed with security and privacy as core principles



Access, transmission, and storage of information for Child Link aligns to strict security protocols



System usage is monitored and auditable. There are offences and penalties under the CWS Act for unauthorised access, use and disclosure of information from Child Link.



Sharing information for children's safety is permitted under laws, such as the *Privacy and Data Protection* Act 2014, the Health Records Act 2001 and the Children, Youth and Families Act 2005

Key roles in Child Link

Child Link Authorisers

- authorise Child Link Users to gain access to Child Link
- are responsible for the ongoing management and removal of Child Link Users




do not have access to child information on Child Link unless they are also a User

Child Link Users

- have access to critical information about children on Child Link to support wellbeing and safety
- most Users will only have access to information about children enrolled or attending their school or service
- can use Child Link as an additional tool alongside their existing frameworks

Who can be a Child Link User in a Catholic school?





 Only principals, acting principals or co-principals can authorise school staff as Child Link Users

Child Link Users in schools

Principals can nominate up to 7 Users, such as:

- Assistant/Deputy principals
- School teachers
- Student wellbeing professionals (e.g. school counsellor, wellbeing coordinator)

Principals as Child Link Users

- A person or body responsible for the governance, conduct or management of non-government schools will authorise school principals as users
- Each Diocese/body will nominate their
 Authoriser/s and set up their process




New Child Link PAL policy for government schools



How Child Link is being used by schools

We have implemented a new process at our school so that when a child enrols with us, a staff member checks Child Link for any relevant information. In new enrolments for 2023 we picked up additional information for 2 children and have been able to put supports in place proactively. This has been brilliant and would not have happened without Child Link.

It helps us as teachers know how to deal with students when they face any problems with us and at home. It also helps us know **how** to take further action solving these problems.





Child Link helps support students transition with information to support schools to plan for Individual Education Plans (IEPs), Behaviour Support Plans supporting access to current and past assessments.
