Leader: We come together to remember and pray for Pope Francis. People loved Pope Francis for his kindness, love for others, and the way he taught us to care for the poor, protect the earth, and love everyone—no matter who they are. Let's remember his life and pray for him as he now rests with God. We light this candle to remember him. In this Easter Season we gather in hope and joy. We gather in thanksgiving for the life of Pope Francis.

Leader: We place this container of soil. This reminds us of Pope Francis's invitation for the whole of humanity to care for the Earth. In his memory we recommit to caring for all creation.

## **Opening Prayer:**

Leader: God of All Creation,

We thank you for the life of Pope Francis, for his love and care for all people, especially the poor, the sick, refugees, and those in need. He showed us how to be kind, gentle, and loving. We pray that he is now with You, resting in Your peace. Please help us remember his example and act in a way like he showed us to do. We ask this through Jesus Amen.

### Gospel:

A reading from the Gospel of Matthew 25:35-40

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink. I was a stranger and you invited me in. I needed clothes and you clothed me. I was sick and you looked after me. I was in prison and you came to visit me."

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?'

"The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

#### Reflection:

How this piece of scripture connects to the life of Pope Francis? What word takes your interest from this scripture? What word or phrase reminds you of Pope Francis?
