Registrations

We are looking forward to welcoming thousands of pilgrims to ACYF later this year, with registrations being received from groups and individuals all across the country! World Youth Day Cross and Icon + Pilgrimage Walk

We are thrilled to share that thanks to a special agreement with the World Youth Day (WYD) 2027 organisers, the WYD Cross and Icon will journey to Melbourne to be part of the Festival. The internationally recognised symbols of WYD – the pilgrim Cross and the Icon of Our Lady Salus Populi Romani – were gifted by St John Paul II to young people of the world in 1984. Since then, they have travelled the globe, uniting millions of young Catholics in prayer and reflection. It will be only the second time they have travelled to Australia, following their visit ahead of WYD 2008.

One of the most anticipated highlights of the Festival will be the Pilgrimage Walk on Sunday 30 November, which will see pilgrims journey from St Patrick's Cathedral through the streets of the city to the Festival venue. The Cross and Icon will lead this powerful procession, opening our Festival experience.

Website updates

Volunteering at the Festival

In order to bring ACYF to life, a dedicated group of volunteers will be needed to support various aspects of the Festival, including logistics, hospitality, liturgy and pastoral care. Expo & Justice Centre

The ACYF 2025 Expo and Justice Activity Centre is a vibrant, interactive hub within the Festival, inviting pilgrims to explore and discern personal vocations through engaging with Catholic organisations, service projects and meaningful dialogue. Through hands-on experiences and representation from a diverse array of Catholic groups, the space aims to inspire young people to embody their discipleship through love, service and mission beyond the Festival itself. The Expo space will include expo stalls, an open stage, games hall and kiosk for lunch and dinner.

With over 70% of our 100 exhibitor spaces already been filled, we encourage those interested in taking part in the expo space to <u>apply</u> soon, as we anticipate capacity will be met shortly.

Prayer and Chapel spaces

We are pleased to share that there will have dedicated prayer and chapel spaces throughout the Festival. With Masses celebrated in Melbourne parishes on the Sunday of the Festival and a large commissioning Mass on the Tuesday of the Festival, groups will have several options to attend a scheduled Mass in the Chapel on the Monday. In addition to Mass on the Monday, the prayer spaces will also be available for quiet prayer – including Eucharistic Adoration and the Sacrament of Reconciliation throughout the Festival.

Safeguarding

The Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne is deeply committed to the care, safety and wellbeing of children and young people as a key responsibility of the Church. This commitment is founded in the teachings and mission of Jesus Christ and lived out with love and justice to ensure the dignity of each human person.

All aspects of the Festival planning place the safety of young people as the focus, from the creation of spaces that are welcoming and safe, the programming, selection of talent and workshop offerings, through to risk management in collaboration with our venue teams.

Risk management

Risk management for the Festival is active and ongoing – embedded into every aspect of our planning and decision-making. For groups planning their pilgrimage to ACYF, we advise that risk management is a shared responsibility. It involves not only the event organisers and venue, but also schools, parishes, ministries and other participating groups, who are directly responsible for the young people they bring as pilgrims.

We stress the importance for all pilgrimage groups of appropriate adult-to-young person supervision ratios. It is also important to identify and communicate clear behaviour expectations, proactive supervision and preparedness to respond to medical or other incidents.

We are preparing a publicly accessible Risk Management Overview to assist groups in the development of their own risk register (which will be unique and specific to their travel mode, number of pilgrims, needs of pilgrims etc.). The Risk Management Overview document will outline

the Festival's overarching approach to managing key risk areas. The Risk Management Overview will be provided, on request, to registered group leaders/coordinators to assist in the planning and preparation for their young people to attend ACYF 2025.
