Greetings


The end of tough restrictions with its awaking of social gatherings has certainly been a welcome relief. I have missed catching up with friends, parishioners and associates. There is certainly a feeling of joy associated with the ability to catch-up, but for many this relief seems to be mingled with some frustration and tiredness. As the end of the year draws near quickly, attention is moving towards wreaths, Christmas and plans for 2022.

Now we are catching-up on postponed lockdown activities. The entry of the double vaccination status, while a blessing, places those required to police this new status under considerable pressure. Bishop Paul Bird's letter of October 29 gives helpful pointers to parish communities on handling the new double jab reality. I wish the best of luck to all who are called into action in the next few weeks.

Since my last letter two of our retired priests have died:



- Fr John Keane joined the diocese after spending time with the Oblates of Mary Immaculate as a Brother. While in OMI John developed a close rapport with many of our farmers through his cattle agistment program and this repour moved him towards our diocese. After his ordination, John worked in the parishes of Ararat, Swan Hill, Warrnambool, Wycheproof, Stawell, Hopetoun and Linton. He is well remembered in the diocese.
- Fr Denis Dennehy was the last of many Irish priests who served in diocese over a long time. Denis' parish commitments included Ararat, Swan Hill, Maryborough, Mortlake, Charlton, Colac and Camperdown. Denis also served in the Diocese of Aitape in Papua New Guinea and the Diocese of Broome, Western Australia. Denis saw his endeavours in PNG as one of the highlights of his priestly life. He suffered a severe stroke while on a visit to Ireland nine years ago and has been in care since then. May he rest in peace.

The next meeting of the Pastoral Planning Panel is scheduled for Thursday, November 11. A draft of the document, *Looking Forward 2021-2025* is in circulation for response. If there are any further responses could they be in before this date.

It has been drawn to my attention that an unvaccinated Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion is taking Communion to a very senior citizen and her children are concerned. Could all parishes keep an eye out for issues like this and try to be pre-emptive where possible. I feel that more issues similar to this will emerge and it is better to be proactive rather than reactive.

Plenary Council

The Catholic Church in Australia has gathered for the first Assembly of the Plenary Council held since the second Vatican Council. The entire People of God in Australia began preparing for this historic moment in 2018 by listening to God and by listening to one another's stories of faith in the 'Listening and Dialogue' phase,



followed by the 'Listening and Discernment' phase. The First Assembly was postponed in 2020 and gathered online from October 3 – 10, 2021.

Synod of Bishops

"For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission"



Early preparation for the Synod of Bishops is underway. The Australian Bishops have their November conference this week with information and suggestions for the dioceses and parishes coming out of this meeting. The diocese will form a support group to help parishes in responding to requests from the National Coordinator, Synod of Bishops 2021-2023, Trudy Dantis. The following information was been received from Trudy:

Upon receiving numerous requests worldwide, the General Secretariat of the Synod of Bishops has decided to extend the deadline for the presentation of the summaries of the consultations by the Episcopal Conferences to 15 August 2022. This means an extension of the diocesan consultation phase and a later date for preparing the diocese synthesised report.

Information regarding the Synod of Bishops will be updated on the ACBC <u>website</u> regularly.

Star of the Sea Parish, South West Coast

Bishop Paul Bird CSsR <u>decreed</u> the establishment of a new parish in the diocese, Star of the Sea, South West Coast as at October 1, 2021. The new parish covers the area of the former parishes of Dennington (est. 1965), Koroit (est. 1886), Port Fairy, (est. 1849), Warrnambool (est. 1853) and Warrnambool West (est. 1970) and includes the DOBCEL schools:

- St John's Primary School, Dennington
- St Patrick's Primary School, Koroit
- St Patrick's Primary School, Port Fairy
- St Joseph's Primary School, Warrnambool
- St Pius X Primary School, Warrnambool West
- Emmanuel College, Warrnambool

Fr John Fitzgerald, Moderator and Fr John Corrigan, Co-Pastor, will continue their service in the new parish.

Ballarat Diocesan Personnel Board Executive Summary

Meeting held Tuesday, September 28, 2021 at the Diocesan Offices via video conference.

Prayer: Led by Bishop Paul Bird CSsR.

In attendance: Bishop Paul Bird, Anne Eskdale, Fiona Murphy, Michael Myers, Frs Kevin Maloney VG, Marcello Colasante, John Fitzgerald, Andrew Hayes, Kevin Lenehan, Ed Moloney, John Monaghan.

Update on items from previous meeting:

- St Paul VI Parish, Wimmera-Mallee began on July 1, 2021.
- Star of the Sea Parish, South-West Coast will begin on October 1, 2021.
- Parishes of Mortlake and Terang: Fr Gary Jones took up his Parish Priest appointment on September 20, 2021. Fr Michael McKinnon will leave for his Peru appointment with the Missionary Society of St Columban in mid-October 2021.
- Parishes of Creswick and Daylesford interim arrangements: Fr Kevin Maloney will be attending to these parishes, with the assistance of other Ballarat based clergy.

Looking Forward planning proposals for parishes from January 2022:

- Our meeting endorsed the Looking Forward plan of Creswick, Daylesford and Gordon parishes working towards amalgamation and Ballarat East and Bungaree parishes similarly working towards amalgamation.
- Creswick, Daylesford and Gordon: In accordance with usual practice, Bishop Paul will seek expressions of interest for the position of Parish Priest in coming weeks with a view to an appointment being announced soon, even if not taking effect until January 2022.
- Ballarat East and Bungaree: Bishop Paul has spoken with Ballarat East Parish Priest Fr Jorge De Chavez OSJ about the possibility of him and Fr Eladio Lizada OSJ jointly serving these parishes.

• Apollo Bay Parish: In view of Fr Wally Tudor's retirement as Parish Priest of Apollo Bay at the end of this year, Bishop Paul will continue consultations about future arrangements for Apollo Bay Parish.

Placement of Matthew Restall and Bill Lowry as deacons (late 2021 and early 2022): We anticipate they will be ordained Deacons in December 2021 and then begin a combined study and parish placement of approximately six months.

Other items:

- Looking Forward plan of Ararat, Stawell and Beaufort Parishes amalgamation: Fr Andrew Hayes asked if consideration could be given to working towards this being put into effect from possibly mid 2022.
- Clergy Appointments: There was discussion about the most appropriate way of seeking expressions of interest and making appointments now that we have much lower clergy numbers in our diocese. It was suggested this could be an agenda item for our November 2021 Council of Priests meeting.

Date for next meeting of Personnel Board: Tuesday, November 23, 2021.

Plenary Council, **First Assembly from October 3-10, 2021:** Commences with Mass videoed from Perth on Sunday, October 3. The agenda and lots of other information is on our diocesan website. Jane Collins will provide updates as this proceeds.


Synod on Synodality, October 17, 2021 – February 28, 2021: Bishop Paul provided us with a timeline of this Synod and our Plenary Council for pre-reading prior to our meeting. It was suggested the Synod agenda could be summarised for discussion in our parishes for feedback from parish councils and other groups.

Other items:

- Pandemic Mass restrictions: The incentive of larger gatherings for those vaccinated is likely to be a temporary measure. We have the challenge of also caring for the unvaccinated, while observing government regulations about limited numbers at gatherings. There is a meeting today between religious leaders and Victorian government representatives to clarify various points, including the question of provisions for people who are unvaccinated for medical reasons.
- World Youth Day 2023: Likely to have pandemic-reduced numbers. Information will be provided nationally then up to individual dioceses to coordinate.

Year of St Joseph



Each month during the year of St Joseph, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference will publish a reflection on the various aspects of St Joseph's life and character. Fr Paul Nulley is a priest of the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn and has been parish priest of St Joseph's, O'Connor since 2017. World Day of the Poor – November 14, 2021

The fifth annual World Day of the Poor has the theme *The Poor will Always Be With You.* In his message for the day, Pope Francis says, "A different approach to poverty is required. This is a challenge that governments and world institutions need to take up with a farsighted social model capable of countering the new forms of poverty that are now sweeping the world and will decisively affect coming decades. If the poor are marginalized, as if they were to blame for their condition, then the very concept of democracy is jeopardized and every social policy will prove bankrupt.



With great humility, we should confess that we are often incompetent when it comes to the poor. We talk about them in the abstract; we stop at statistics and we think we can move people's hearts by filming a documentary. Poverty, on the contrary, should motivate us to creative planning, aimed at increasing the freedom needed to live a life of fulfilment according to the abilities of each person." *Pope Francis, Message for the World Day of the Poor 2021, n 7.*


Bicentenary Commemorative Book

We Remember

Sr Anne McMillam rsm

On Wednesday, September 8, 2021 Sr Anne McMillan died peacefully at St John of God Hospital, Ballarat, aged 82 years.

Anne was born on July 15, 1939 in Mildura and completed her schooling locally and then enrolled at Sacred Heart College, Ballarat East to finish her secondary education. At this stage Anne felt the call to Religious life, but her father insisted she have some career before joining, so she trained as a Librarian and subsequently worked in Colac and Mildura before joining the Sisters of Mercy, Ballarat East in 1962 and was known as Sister M Philippa.

Anne's early ministry as a Sister of Mercy was in parish schools in Ballarat and Robinvale. Following this, Anne was well known and respected during her 35 years of service to the Catholic Diocese of Ballarat. Her most significant contribution was her involvement in Adult Education, Pastoral Planning, Liturgy and her creativity can be seen throughout the diocese. Anne worked consistently to provide the laity with the opportunity to contribute to parish life. Anne is remembered as a much loved and valued friend, colleague and mentor in the Bishop's Office. May she rest peacefully in God's care.

Sr Elizabeth Hennesey csb



Earlier this year on February 4, Sr Elizabeth Hennessy csb died very peacefully in Nazareth House Ballarat. Over the 11 years Elizabeth was in residence, she was very well cared for and much loved by staff and friends.

Elizabeth was born in Dublin. At the age of 18 Elizabeth and two friends left home and country at the age of 18 and travelled by ship to join the Brigidine Mission in Australia. Elizabeth was known to many as Sr Cyprian and began the first eight years of her teaching ministry in Ararat. Over the years she moved to other schools in Geelong, Rochester, Beechworth, Albert Park, Horsham and Ardeer. She was a very competent teacher and well-liked by her pupils.

Elizabeth returned to Ararat in 1987, 'retired from school' but was still very involved in parish life and visiting the sick. In 2010, Elizabeth chose to retire to Nazareth House where she had previously spent a couple of respite times. May she rest in God's loving presence.


